Here's an example of what you would learn at our **Maximising Your Vacation Credits** session.
How much of this did you already know?

- Within Club Wyndham South Pacific there are four different Vacation Credit types used in exchange for reserving rooms. All types of Vacation Credits are of equal value; however, their eligibility differs.
WMTS – Lifestyle Qualified Credits.
WMA – Purchased before 1 May 2010.
WM – Purchased after 1 May 2010, opted out of Lifestyle or bought from non-Wyndham sources.
Incentive Credits – Awarded for referrals, promotions, or trial programs.
- Vacation Credits are valid for two years and expire on the last day of your Anniversary Month – which is the month your Vacation Credits were originally issued.
- You can make reservations with check-in dates at Club Wyndham South Pacific resorts 13 months in advance.
- We send multiple email reminders nine, six, three and one month before your Vacation Credits are due to expire, then seven and three days out, and finally, on the last day of the month.
- You can gift your stay to your family and friends and have them as your guest. Just make sure to notify the Owner Services team or select 'for a guest' when booking online.
- If you have an RCI membership, you can deposit your credits and get an additional two years' validity.

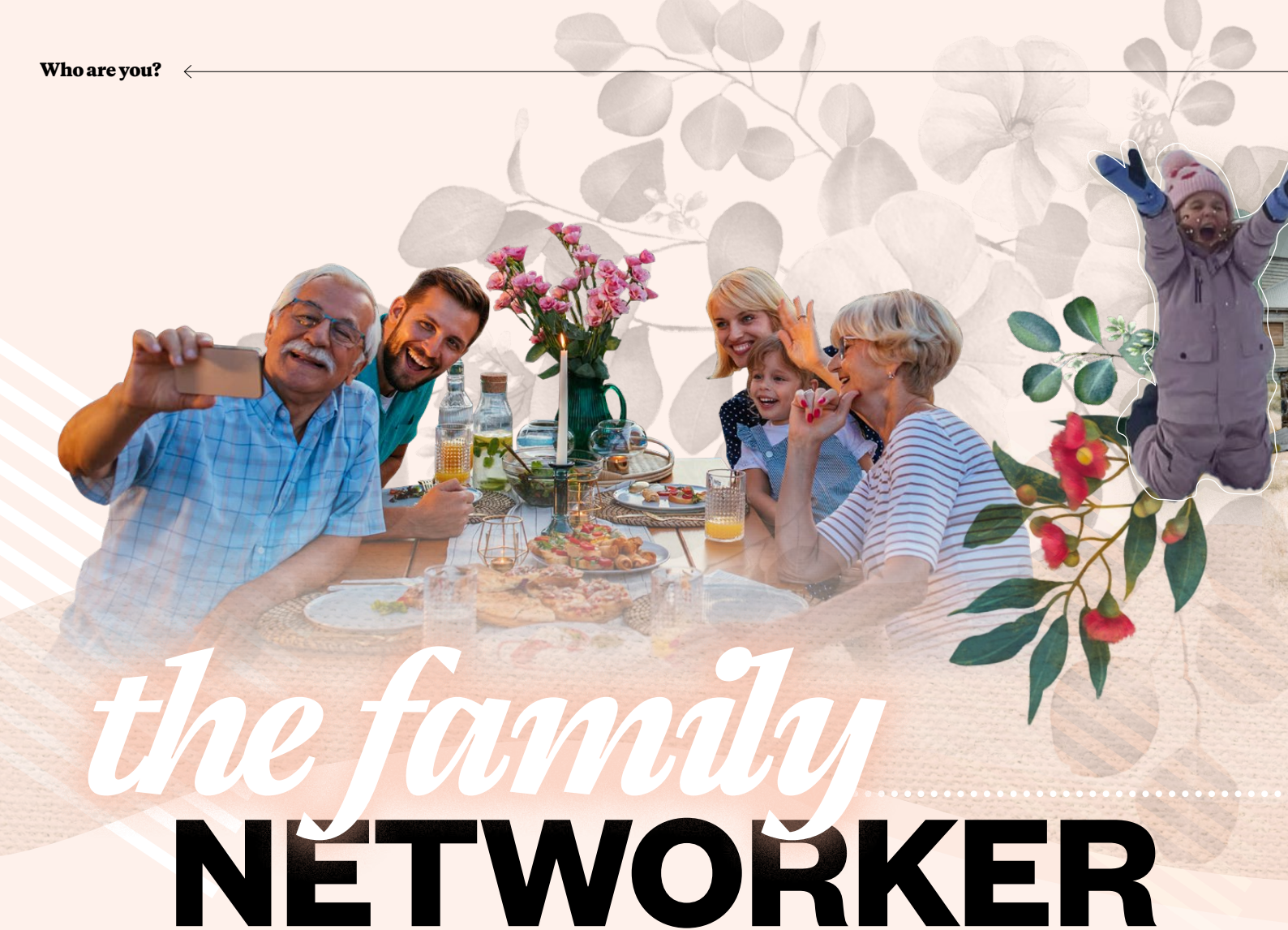

Are you the one who holds the family together? Without your organisational skills, would the family vacation ever get off the ground?

With a variety of large, multi-bedroom apartments with space for intergenerational travel, Club Wyndham South Pacific is your secret planning weapon.

Many club resorts also offer opportunities for families to spend time together soaking in a huge pool, talking around a barbecue, getting a sweat up on a tennis court or exploring the region with bikes. You can look at each resort in more detail at clubwyndhamsp.com.

» Club Wyndham Flynn's Beach

The three four-bedroom Presidential villas at Club Wyndham Flynn's Beach are positioned at the edge of the property, surrounded by gum trees and with a lazy creek running by. They are ideally suited for families of up to eight people.

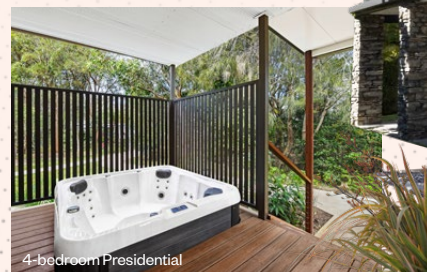
The villas offer an upper floor balcony with a day bed and a lower floor balcony with a spa, where owners or their guests can watch the world go by, and a barbecue and outdoor setting for entertainment. Bedrooms offer the comfort of king beds (doubles in two bedrooms and singles in the other two), while the villa offers four bathrooms, all with showers.

The Presidential villas are designed to be an unparalleled product in the region and are understandably popular. For that reason, you may want to book the 2-bedroom Grand Garden or the 3-bedroom Grand Garden, which can both house six people, or the 3-bedroom, 3-bedroom Deluxe or 3-bedroom Grand apartments in the original building, all of which can cater for eight.

For a slightly higher credit cost, the Garden apartments put you in the midst of nature and closer to the lagoon pool, while offering air conditioning throughout and King bedding in the main bedroom. The original apartments, however, represent excellent value for credits.

» Club Wyndham Dinner Plain, Mt Hotham

Club Wyndham Dinner Plain offers two four-bedroom Grand chalets, which feature some of the largest floor plans in Club Wyndham South Pacific. Both of these have a maximum occupancy of eight people, with Queen beds in two bedrooms and Queen splits in the other two, and two bathrooms.

The chalets have a full kitchen with fridge, oven, cooktop and microwave, and a gas barbecue – perfect for cooking family feasts – while the expansive living room and the balcony or deck offer ideal places to tuck in. Each chalet has a washer and dryer, and three televisions with pay TV channels and casting ability.

These chalets are booked quickly during peak season (winter), so we would recommend trying Dinner Plain outside the ski and snow season. The slopes shake off the snow and reveal the legendary high country huts where stockmen stayed when they travelled through with their livestock in days gone by, wildflower-rich landscapes and snow gum forests.

The nearby Alpine National Park is a perfect place to adventure in the summer, with world-class mountain bike trails, opportunities to ride on horseback, four-wheel drive trails at Wonnangatta, and stunning white water at the Mitta Mitta River. The state's highest peak, Mt Bogong, and second-highest peak, Mount Feathertop, provide an awesome view of The Razorback and are well worth the climb!



» Club Wyndham Wanaka

The four-bedroom Presidential at Club Wyndham Wanaka is renowned for being one of the finest apartments in Club Wyndham South Pacific. The two Presidential apartments (one three-bedroom and one four-bedroom) were the focus of the second phase of an NZ\$2.2 million refurbishment that recently concluded.

Capturing a theme of “alpine luxury”, the Presidential apartments were enhanced with wool carpets throughout and real leather dining chairs. The gas fireplace and television are part of a stone feature wall, while pendant lighting adds class to the living spaces. The colour palette is neutral, while feature walls, cushions and blankets of olive and tan offer pops of colour.

The 189-square-metre four-bedroom apartment is designed with entertaining in mind, and features an expansive living room; fully equipped wet bar; full kitchen with stone benchtops, stainless steel appliances, and underfloor heating; and an immense balcony with outdoor setting, dining area, six-burner barbecue, TV, sun loungers and Jacuzzi.

Wanaka is shaking off the perception that it is only a ski destination. We recommend trying the summer, when the Presidential will be easier to book, and when the temperate weather is kinder to outdoor gatherings. It will also be a little more pleasant for jet boating, bungee jumping, rock climbing and rafting.

The walking trails of the legendary Mount Aspiring National Park will be more accessible, too. If it feels like you're in Middle Earth, it should: these slopes appeared on the silver screen throughout the Lord of the Rings trilogy.

THE CULTURE *seeker*

Many of us travel to enhance our knowledge of past civilisations or empires, deepen our understanding of the spiritual beliefs of others, or experience a different culture first-hand.

Whether visiting the diverse temples across the Island of the Gods, exploring landmarks of cultural importance in samurai-era Japan, or visiting the remnants of nations past in the open plains and hills of Northern France, travel can push us beyond our comfort zones and teach us something new.

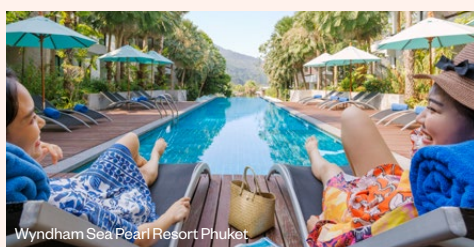
» Phuket

Say the name “Phuket” and travellers will instantly think of blue-green waters and white-sand beaches, but the island’s offering goes far beyond its appearance. Phuket is home to significant religious and cultural sites providing insight into the Thai experience.

The Great Buddha of Phuket is probably the largest landmark on the island and one of the most distinctive in Thailand. At a height of 45 metres, this statue of a seated Gautama Buddha towers over Nakkerd Hill near Chalong.

Phuket’s most significant temple, Wat Chalong or Wat Chaiyathararam, houses a splinter of the great religious leader’s bone. Only constructed in the 19th Century, it is situated in Chalong Bay and features a 60-metre high stupa (dome-shaped shrine) offering panoramic views.

Many travellers are aware of Phuket’s religious significance but the island’s history prior to the prevalence of tourism is lesser known. The Phuket Mining Museum highlights the importance of the tin industry to the area. It is on the site of an area formerly rich in natural resources and features a history section with wax figures, a mine with small figures and tiny tools, and a scale model of Phuket town from the past.



» Bali

Bali is called the “Island of the Gods”, due to its devotion to the Hindu religion and its multitude of creative and beautiful temples. Here are some of the island’s must-visit cultural spots:

Uluwatu Temple

Perched on a western-facing cliff, Uluwatu Temple offers breathtaking views and dramatic sunset photos. It is surrounded by a forest inhabited by cheeky monkeys – and, if you visit, make sure you stay after sunset for the kecak fire dance at the temple’s amphitheatre. Thirty-five minutes from Vivara Bali Private Pool Villas and Spa.

Ulun Danu Beratan Temple

Potentially, Bali’s most famous temple, this pyramid-shaped wonder appears to float on the water of Lake Beratan. Two hours from Wyndham Tamansari Jivva Resort Bali.

Pura Besakih

Termed the “Mother Temple”, Pura Besakih is a complex at the base of Mount Agung that features up to 80 temples. It is at the heart of some of the island’s key Hindu traditions and ceremonies. Close to an hour from Wyndham Tamansari Jivva Resort Bali.

Tanah Lot Temple

One of the island’s most recognisable temples, Tanah Lot Temple is positioned just off the coast on an elevated island, accessible only on foot at low tide. You might recognise it from the 2010 movie *Eat Pray Love*, starring Hollywood icon Julia Roberts. About an hour-and-a-half from Lumbini Luxury Villas and Spa.

» Nagano

Many tourists are still scratching the surface exploring Japan in Tokyo or its ski fields. Japan is a diverse country offering breathtaking national parks, flavoursome cuisine, relaxing onsens and a multi-faceted culture.

Nagano is a province famous for its ski fields, but its allure goes so much deeper. Its Matsumoto Castle, one of the oldest castles in Japan, is one of the nation's twelve remaining original castles and a designated national treasure. Constructed in 1594, it was almost pulled down late in the 19th Century, only for locals to fight for it. A group of people

dressed as nobles, ninjas and samurai, representing some of the Matsumoto's famous personalities, travel through on a daily basis to bring the castle to life.

The region's Zenkoji temple dates back to 642. As Buddhism spread throughout Asia, an image was enshrined on the site in that year, making it the oldest statue enshrined in the country. It regularly changed hands through the tumultuous period between 1467 to 1615, but was returned to the temple after a warlord had a dream where the statue told him it wanted to return home!

Then there's the Edo-era period

town of Narai-juku, which served as an important outpost between Kyoto and Tokyo (when it was called Edo). Although the world has since moved on, Narai-juku has kept most of its original architecture, meaning the town provides an untouched picture of the design, crafts and transport in that era. Some of the buildings have stood since the 1600s! The town's craftspeople have a reputation for excellent souvenirs so you may want to peruse their lacquerware, sake and delicacies.

» Normandy

Travellers to Europe are constantly amazed at the depth of the continent's history, and the constant reworking of empires, nations and states. Normandy, a province of France that was once a nation, is steeped in history and, like most of France, features historical wonders around every corner.

The ancient abbey of Mont Saint-Michel, on the northwestern coast of France, is a UNESCO World

Heritage Site and draws more than three million people each year. The story goes that it was constructed after a local bishop was visited by the archangel Michael in 708 and told to build the church on the island. Although there is now a raised path to the fortress, the sea surrounds the island during high tide, creating a natural defence which deterred military powers in the past.

Another historically significant location in Normandy is Rouen, the famous site of Joan of Arc's execution. The town's Historical Jeanne d'Arc is a museum exhibiting the rise and fall of the French military leader, while the Tour de la Pucelle, where she was imprisoned, is just 1km away.

the nature LOVER

There's something about immersing yourself in nature that centres you, recharges you, and makes your escape feel complete! Fortunately, you have club resorts in some of the world's most beautiful natural environments to fully remove yourself from the hustle and bustle of life.



» Club Wyndham Seven Mile Beach

Picking a favourite wilderness experience in Tasmania is like asking a parent to pick their favourite child.

To the north of the island, there's the expansive Tarkine Wilderness, the dynamic Cradle Mountain outside of Launceston and the breathtaking colours of the Bay of Fires on the northeast coast. Within driving distance of Club Wyndham Seven Mile Beach, there is Wineglass Bay and the Freycinet National Park, and the Huon Valley.

The island has more walks and trails than you can count – however, one of the most memorable is at Mount Field National Park, less than two hours from your club resort. During autumn, Tasmania's only deciduous tree, the deciduous beech, begins to shed its leaves and turn the hillsides around the Tarn Shelf an array of gold, orange and red. It's called the "turning of the fagus" and the natural phenomenon draws people from all over Tasmania and beyond. This 12km walk through the fagus

and past glacial lakes will be one of the most breathtaking and picturesque you do. Late April and May are the season to see this colourful display.

The Tessellated Pavement at Eaglehawk Neck, about an hour from your club resort, is a photographer's delight. These tile-like rocks were formed when the earth's movement fractured them through jointing – where the rock doesn't displace either side of the fracture – and salt crystals and erosion deepened the pattern.

You could see this natural wonder while visiting Port Arthur nearby.

And, finally, look up! Tasmania is one of the few places in Australia where you can see the Aurora Australis. Look for a location with little light pollution and as far south as you can go – like Bruny Island, Mount Wellington, Cockle Creek or even South Arm Peninsula, just 20 minutes' from your club resort. You'll need to go in winter, but that's a perfect time for Club Wyndham Seven Mile Beach (more on that later in the story).

» Club Wyndham Surfers Paradise

The Gold Coast is synonymous with theme parks and golden beaches, and its wilderness values are still underrated.

Lamington National Park is part of the UNESCO World Heritage Listed Gondwana Rainforests of Australia, alongside Springbrook, Mount Barney and Main Range. Together, they date back to dinosaur times and have a diverse range of flora and fauna, including rare brush-tailed rock wallabies, Albert's lyrebirds, whipbirds, and the largest remaining clusters of hoop pines. The park features 160 kilometres of walks so don't just put aside one day!

Visit the nearby Springbrook National Park at night for a guided tour to see the famous resident colony of glow worms and microbats. You can also see fireflies and glowing fungi on summer nights. And the park is home to the famed rock arch, Natural Bridge – an Instagram-worthy structure formed by a waterfall wearing away a basalt cave.

» Club Wyndham Dunsborough

Geographe Bay is a wide, giant bay fringed by white sand beaches and sheltered coves. Just steps from your club property, it is the perfect place for swimming, kayaking or stand up paddle boarding (and you can hire a kayak or paddle board for free at the property).

While the Margaret River region is famous for its wine and local produce, it offers a stunning coastline with beautiful limestone reefs, rugged hills and dynamic headlands looking out over the Indian Ocean.

The famed 130-kilometre coastal Cape to Cape track – from Cape Naturaliste in the north to Cape Leeuwin in the south – is a multi-day trail, or, if you're happy with just a taste, you can see some of the best landscapes through shorter walks at Cape Naturaliste. The cape is also the ideal spot to watch whales migrate between September and December.

The Ngilgi Cave is one of the most memorable experiences near Dunsborough. Above ground, you'll learn about its significance to First

Nations culture over the course of tens of thousands of years and, inside, you'll gasp in wonder at the incredible stalactites, stalagmites and helictites. European settlers, upon finding them late in the 19th Century, saw Ngilgi Cave – and others in the area – as being of interest to tourists. These caves became the start of Western Australia's tourism industry.



Do you always have the festive season earmarked for holidays in your calendar? Or perhaps you like making the most out of your annual leave and book a break between all the public holidays?

Many Club Wyndham South Pacific resorts feature facilities including pools, sports courts, gyms, barbecue areas, and large open spaces - making them the perfect locations for family festivities.

First, a word of warning: Christmas and New Year are the most popular times of year to book, so we recommend doing it early! They are also generally peak season.

If you don't get the accommodation you want the first time around, consider Waitlisting. You never know what will happen!

All the following resorts feature comprehensive school activity programs.

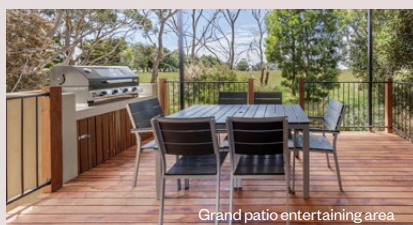


THE *festive* TRAVELLER

» Club Wyndham Phillip Island

Set on 65 acres of native Australian bushland, Club Wyndham Phillip Island is the ideal spot to spread out. The resort boasts spacious cottage-style accommodation – all equipped with kitchens – and outdoor and indoor pools, a children's pool, health centre, sauna and tennis courts. Importantly, it has FlameTrees Restaurant & Bar and outdoor barbecue areas, so you're covered if you want to eat out or if you want to cook your own feast.

It's also just two hours from Melbourne – so it's a perfect escape if you could only secure a few days off over the Christmas or New Year period. Club Wyndham Phillip Island is also a bigger resort, with 137 cottages, improving the supply-demand equation for owners wanting to make a reservation. However, we would still recommend booking early!



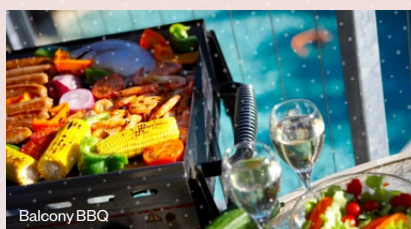

» Club Wyndham Flynns Beach

A family friendly pool and spa are the focal point of Club Wyndham Flynns Beach. The resort also features several large barbecues and sitting areas throughout the grounds, and Henry's Restaurant and Bar for those who don't feel like cooking. Owners can hire bikes, e-bikes, beach equipment, body boards, surf boards, fishing rods and board games through the club's generous complimentary activities program.

With 112 club rooms, Club Wyndham Flynns Beach is one of the club's bigger resorts and another one where the supply-demand balance may make it easier to book during a festive period.

» Club Wyndham Torquay

Another destination perfect for a quick escape from city life is two hours in the other direction from Melbourne: Club Wyndham Torquay. This resort offers a massive outdoor lagoon pool, heated indoor lap pool, children's playground, gym and tennis court. Like Club Wyndham Phillip Island, the hotel offers owners and guests a dining venue in Winkipops, and barbecue areas.

If you are thinking about trying Club Wyndham Torquay for Christmas or New Year, this would be an opportune time, as the resort apartments will undergo a refurbishment this year. There are more details in the Club News section on page 26.

» Club Wyndham Denarau Island - and other popular festive choices

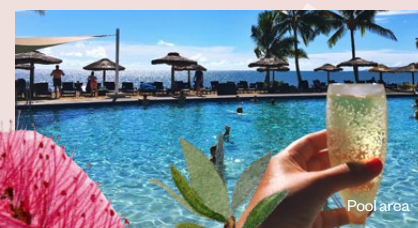
Like most things in life, it pays to be flexible. Around Christmas and New Year time, Club Wyndham Denarau Island experiences unprecedented popularity. Most owners also travel overseas to the resort, so they tend to plan and book early.

However, if you are flexible, there are instances where you might be able to pick up a late booking at Club Wyndham Denarau Island – or any other heavily booked resort. Our team always recommends submitting a Waitlist, but the Waitlist ceases to look for matches 14 days out from the check-out date of your reservation at most resorts. Typically, there is a short period where any very late cancellation will not cycle through the Waitlist and, instead, appear in general availability. Club Wyndham Denarau Island is an Exotic Resort, so cancellations will cease to cycle through Waitlists 30 days out.

Another word of warning: this is not a guarantee for getting the reservation you want – however, it is a reminder that it pays to be checking availability frequently and to be flexible in your planning!

THE *bargain* HUNTER

In this economy – in any economy, really – it's always a good idea to save where possible. Are you the type of traveller who always hunts for a bargain when it comes to airfares, experiences or accommodation?

Just for you, we have put together a list of stay ideas you may not have considered, where you can get excellent value for your vacation credits.



» Club Wyndham Pokolbin Hill

Club Wyndham Pokolbin Hill offers a 2-bedroom apartment during RED season for 10,000 credits for the week. This is excellent value for times like Christmas, New Year and other school holidays.



» Club Wyndham Flynns Beach

Club Wyndham Flynns Beach was originally just 60 apartments in a multi-storey building onsite, before the second stage of garden townhouse-style accommodation was added in 2021. The inventory in both stages has slightly different credit charts. The original studios have an immense floor plan, with a full kitchen, laundry facilities, and large balcony, and these are just 7,000 credits during RED season, 3,000 credits during BLUE season and 5,000 credits during WHITE season.

» Club Wyndham Surfers Paradise

The Gold Coast is popular even during low season (and the temperature is pleasant, especially for those travelling from the south), and Club Wyndham Surfers Paradise is entirely generously sized one- and two-bedroom apartments. A one-bedroom low floor (floors one to seven) is available during BLUE season for a week for just 5,300 credits, and WHITE season for just 7,900 credits.

» Club Wyndham Seven Mile Beach

Club Wyndham Seven Mile Beach has some of the least expensive BLUE season inventory across the club. You can get an expansive 1-bedroom apartment for just 1,550 credits for a week during BLUE season and a 1-bedroom Deluxe for 1,900 credits (3,000 credits and 3,300 credits respectively for WHITE season).

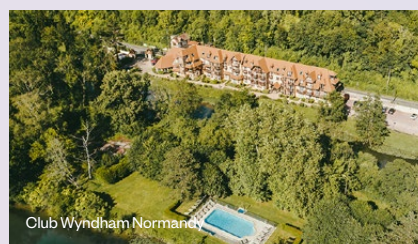

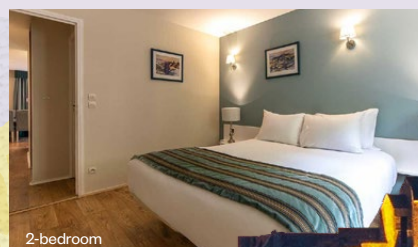
» Club Wyndham Normandy

All your club European properties represent value for credits. At Normandy, RED1 is the peak period, which lasts for just over a month during summer. However, this tends to be a period that can be unpleasantly hot in Europe. The continent has a significant shoulder season where the heat is more temperate, and these fall within the RED2 and WHITE seasons.

You can reserve a studio Deluxe for a week during WHITE season for 5,350 credits, and RED2 for 7,050. A 2-bedroom apartment is 10,650 credits during WHITE season and 14,150 during RED2 season.

Through their free programs such as Winds of Joy, Wright of Passage, and community sailing days, they create safe, inclusive spaces where participants build confidence, develop teamwork, and discover resilience. These programs allow the participants to sail a large yacht that has been modified to ensure easy accessibility, and learn new trade and technical skills.

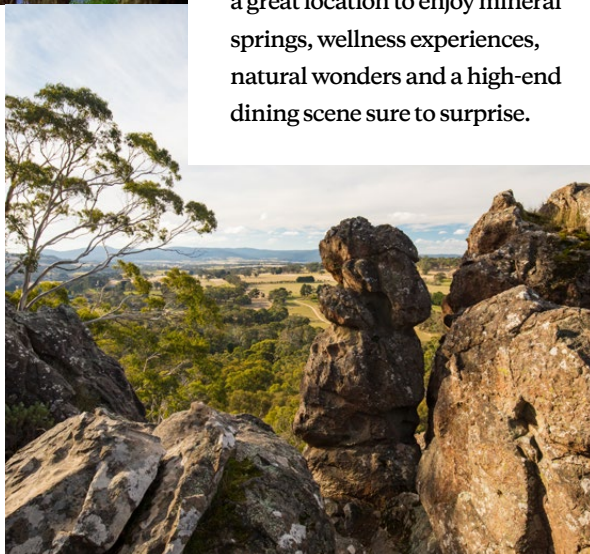


Enjoy Days in Daylesford

Tell me more about Daylesford...

Daylesford is a place many Australians have become familiar with this year, as the site of the 2025 season of TV renovation show, *The Block*. It's every bit as beautiful and expansive as the show suggests, and a great location to enjoy mineral springs, wellness experiences, natural wonders and a high-end dining scene sure to surprise.





Firstly, Daylesford is considered the spa and hot springs capital of Australia. The springs themselves are in Hepburn Springs, just five minutes' drive from the centre of Daylesford town - conveniently, where your club resort is also based. These waters are said to have significant health benefits, and the best places to enjoy them are the Hepburn Bathhouse & Spa and The Mineral Spa, both within walking distance.

Want to follow that up with an indulgent spa treatment? You have boundless options to choose from, starting from Spa at Lake House and Daylesford Day Spa in town, and options like Maiaveda or Ellenis Day Spa in Kyneton, Prani Glow Day Spa in nearby Musk, or Samadhi Spa and Wellness Retreat in Glenlyon.

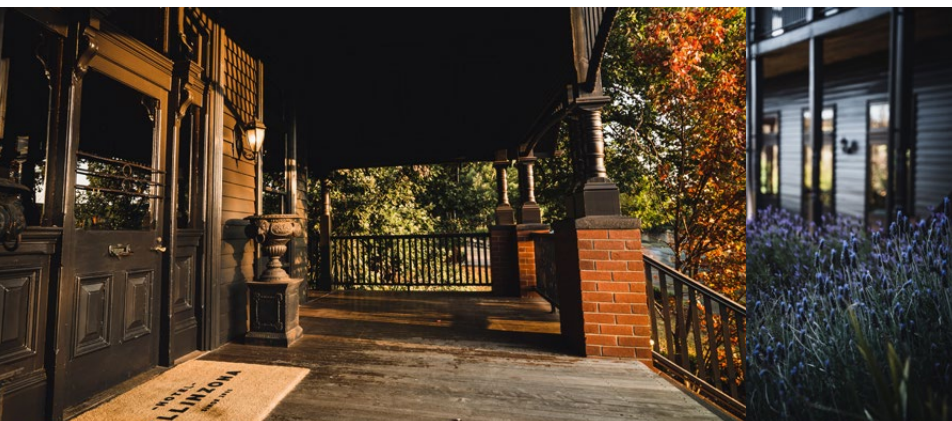
There's nothing like a day surrounded by green trees and fresh air to centre your soul! A walk around Lake Daylesford or a visit to the Wombat Hill will do you the world of good. When you're done with the natural attractions, Daylesford also boasts one of Victoria's leading dining scenes. Make sure you try the multi course à la carte menu at two-hatted Lake House or try a seven or ten-course Japanese degustation at hatted restaurant Kadota, or explore fine dining using local ingredients at the resort's own Virgin Kitchen. Leave a day or two for a slow trip around the region's cellar doors and distilleries to enjoy a locally produced cool climate wine or an artisan gin and tonic.

Daylesford is also fast developing a reputation for major events. 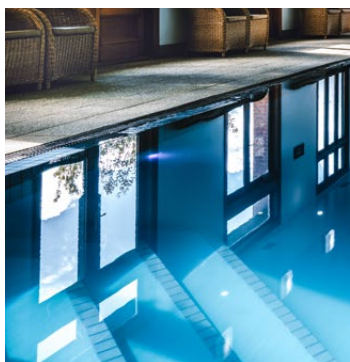
Club Wyndham Bellinzona Hepburn Springs, Daylesford

A Savvy Traveller's Guide to the ultimate ROAD • TRIP

QUEENSLAND - SUNSHINE STATE



The eastern Queensland coast from Port Douglas to the New South Wales border is 1,832 kilometres in length. In theory, it's a road trip that can be completed in under 21 hours... but who would pass by that beauty so quickly? We'd recommend a longer road trip with stays at your club properties on the way.

Here's our runsheet - but we have plenty of places to get through and not much room to detail it, so strap yourself in and hang on tight!

1 Stay: CLUB WYNDHAM PORT DOUGLAS

Our road trip starts in Port Douglas – though we recommend flying into the Cairns Airport and hiring a car from there. Port Douglas is all about the two World Heritage Areas – the Great Barrier Reef and the Daintree Rainforest.

At close to 350,000 square kilometres, the Great Barrier Reef is the world's largest coral system. From Port Douglas, you can explore this Heritage Listed wonder in almost any way you could imagine – snorkelling, scuba diving, catamaran, sailing or even by plane. Agincourt Reef, the outer Ribbon Reefs and the nearby Low Isles are the easily accessible spots.

As the world's oldest tropical rainforest, there's no better way to explore the mighty Daintree than being guided by the people who know the region better than anyone else. The local Indigenous community is more than happy to take tourists on a guided Ngadiku Dreamtime Walk just outside Port Douglas and explain more about Kuku Yalanji culture.



2

Stay: CLUB WYNDHAM CAIRNS

The second stop on our trip is just one hour and fifteen minutes south, and our origin point: Cairns. You can still easily access the Great Barrier Reef and Daintree, but there are some other must-visit attractions, too.

Kuranda is a unique village perched on a mountain, with commanding views of the tropical rainforest and the Barron Gorge National Park. Don't leave the town before you have visited the Heritage Markets, Koala Gardens, Birdworld and Butterfly Sanctuary. You can access it either by a scenic railway climb or a skyrail cableway over the breathtaking rainforest.

One of the most famed family attractions of Cairns is the Foreshore. Sandy shores and timber decking ring in the 4,800 square metre saltwater Cairns Lagoon, while grassy parklands, beach volleyball courts, a skate park and playgrounds spread out in each direction.



5

Stay: CLUB WYNDHAM MARCOOLA BEACH OR CLUB WYNDHAM GOLDEN BEACH

At 11 hours and 10 minutes, this is the most demanding leg of the coastal stretch, and we'd recommend at least two drivers to alternate this – or a stop along the way.

One of the Sunshine Coast's must-visit attractions is Australia Zoo, home of the legendary croc hunter, Steve Irwin. See his friends and family feed these giants at the Crocoseum daily, learn more about Australia's famous wildlife or get a sight of lions, zebras and rhinos in your own backyard.

Another must-do is the short but challenging walk up Mount Coolool. It'll take you just 45 minutes to reach the summit, where a commanding view of the entire Sunshine Coast coastline awaits you.



3

Stay: CLUB WYNDHAM MISSION BEACH

One hour and fifty minutes south is Club Wyndham South Pacific's newest Queensland location: Mission Beach.

Mission Beach is the closest point to the Great Barrier Reef by boat – it takes less than an hour to get from Clump Point to Beaver Reef, and you will rarely meet other vessels. Dunk Island is just 15 minutes away and offers a challenge to hikers with Mount Kootaloo, and a World War II radar station and old airstrip to see.

The area's surrounded by the Wet Tropics Rainforest, a 900,000 hectare wonderland boasting significant examples of biological evolution and relics of ancient Gondwana forest.



6

Stay: CLUB WYNDHAM CROWN TOWERS, CLUB WYNDHAM SURFERS PARADISE OR CLUB WYNDHAM KIRRA BEACH

Two hours down the road, the Gold Coast is famous for its beaches. There's something for everyone: pumping waves at The Spit or Greenmount, the calm seclusion of Tugun, or the energy of crowds at Surfers Paradise. Looking for a good spot for little ones? Try the broadwater at Paradise Point, Labrador or the Broadwater Parklands.

Get your heart racing with a visit to one of the city's four major theme parks: Movie World, built around Warner Bros characters and movies; Wet 'n' Wild, where your swimmers are a must; Sea World, a home for aquatic wildlife and performers; and Dreamworld, a collection of the scariest rides in the Southern Hemisphere.



4

Stay: CLUB WYNDHAM AIRLIE BEACH WHITSUNDAYS

Further south – a five hour and 45-minute trip – Airlie Beach is on the edges of another water wonderland waiting to be discovered.

The town is an excellent base for exploring the Great Barrier Reef, but the more obvious attractions are the Whitsunday Islands perched on its doorstep. Among them are famous Daydream Island and Hamilton Island, and the sparkling clear Whitehaven Beach, often ranked one of the best in the world. There are many ways to explore these jewels, including catamaran tour; the former Sydney to Hobart-turned-luxury vessel, The Lady Enid; a private charter or by seaplane.

When you're done exploring the reef, there are restaurants, bars and cafes aplenty for chilling out along the foreshore. If you're not sure where to go, Just Tuk'n Around can show you the best spots in your very own tuk-tuk.

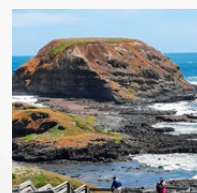
ALMOST FROM THE BEGINNING: 23 YEARS OF MEMORIES, 25 YEARS OF THE CLUB

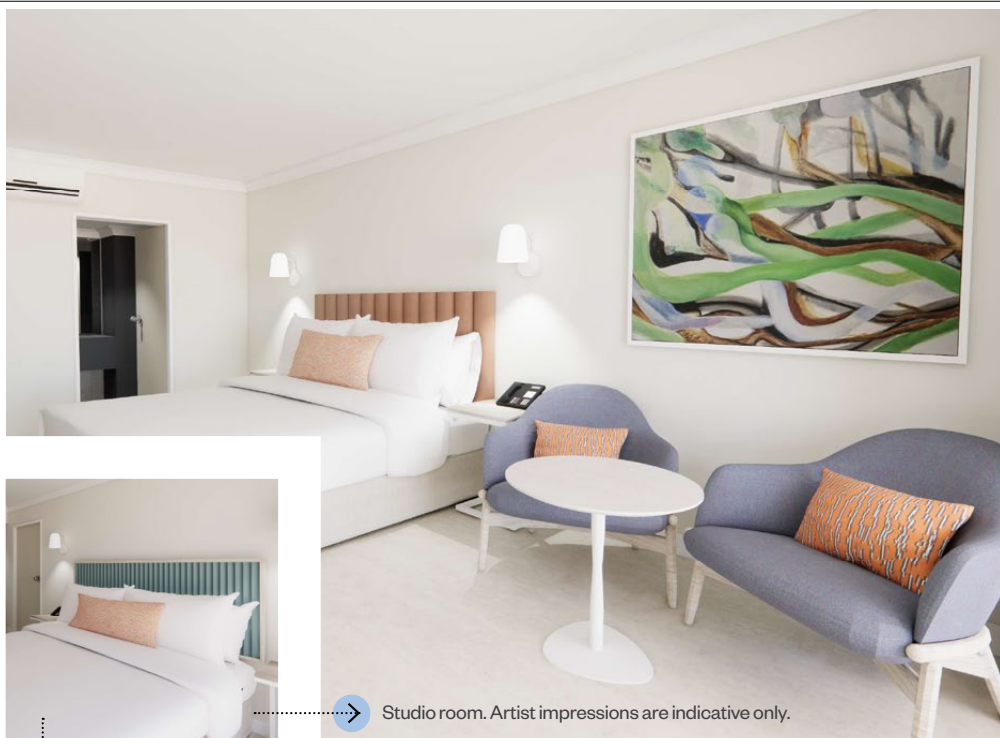

Common areas including the reception area, internal corridors, and gym are repainted and renovated in line with the new palette.

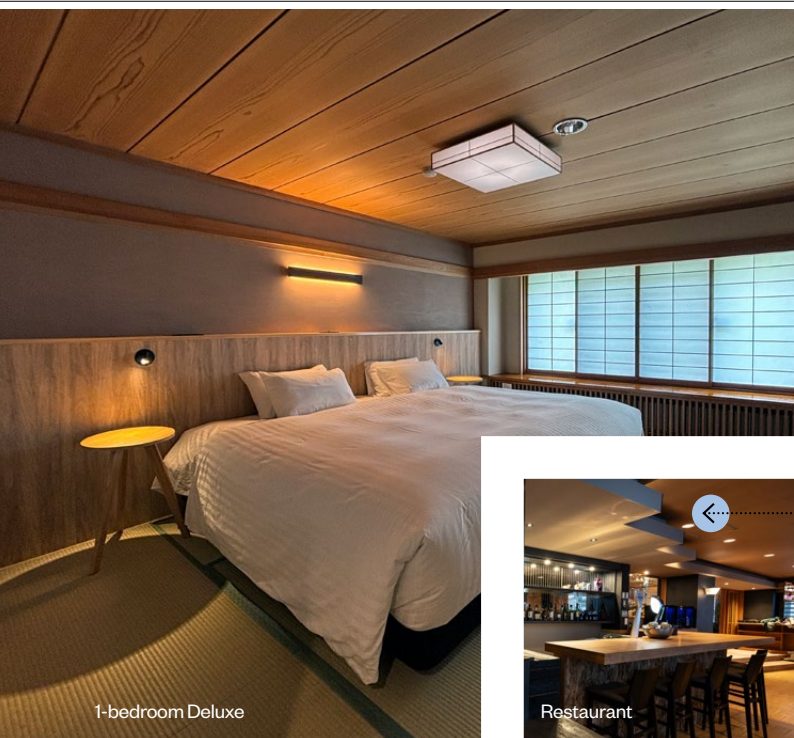

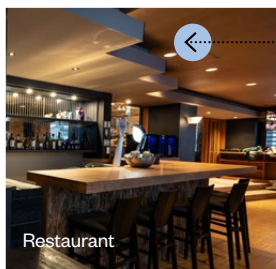

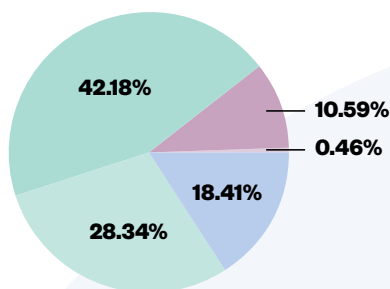

Sundance Resort Club

Club Wyndham South Pacific's inventory in Sundance Resort Club is structured in a different way to the inventory to the left. The club owns 137,875 points within Sundance Resort Club, which enables owners to access all Sundance Resort Club's 16 resorts and apartments. The rest of the Sundance Resort Club points are owned by that club's members and other vacation clubs managed by Travel + Leisure Co.



This arrangement means Club Wyndham South Pacific owners can access a broader range of inventory – all 191 Sundance Resort Club rooms – for a lesser financial commitment to the club than if the inventory was purchased directly. The club does not own the rooms. Bookings at some resorts need to be made through Owner Services.

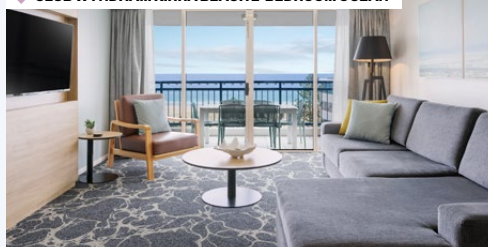
